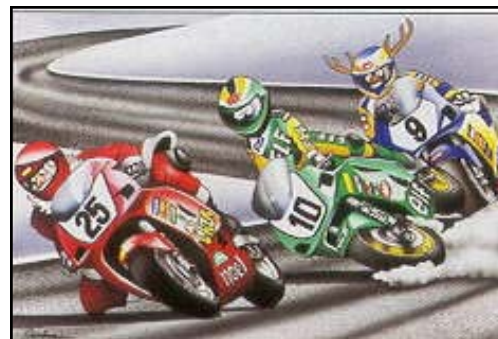

Nevada County Toy Run

Our club has participated for many years and we're going again this year. Gary Stofer and Bryan Wright will lead riders from the Western Coffee Pot on Saturday, Dec 13th.

The following information is taken from the toy run web site and shows just how much this toy run has helped the community.

The Nevada County Food & Toy Run is both a "non-profit charitable" organization and an event.

In 1991 four motorcyclists thought about what they could do to

help families in need during the upcoming holiday season. They came up with an interesting idea and within a few weeks created an event. The event drew 90 bikers and a responsive crowd was struck in merchants, law-enforcement personnel, and the residents in the small sierra-foothill communities of Nevada City and Grass Valley. The event was the birth of the Nevada County Food & Toy Run, a "non-profit charitable" organization sponsoring fundraisers to help families in need.

Every second Saturday in December for the last 10 years hundreds of motorcyclists rumble through the towns of Nevada City and Grass Valley on the way to the Nevada County Fairgrounds where hundreds of children and adults await in anticipation of their arrival.

Needy families receive a Christmas turkey, 10 lb. bag of potatoes and canned goods to take home for the Holidays. Each child receives at least 3 toys and everyone celebrates with live music, food and raffle prizes in a vivacious atmosphere.

The upcoming 11th annual Nevada County Food & Toy Run could easily see over 1000 bikes participating in the escorted procession from Nevada City Rood Center to the Grass Valley Fairgrounds.

Two of the original four bikers, Thom Staser and Theresa Manzinali are still organizing the event and have recently been joined by Carmen Renfrow. They plan to expand the Nevada County Food & Toy Run beyond a single event. Plans forthcoming.

The Nevada County Food & Toy Run benefits many families

and children directly during our annual bike run in December. Other service organizations that receive assistance throughout the year from us include:

- Big Brothers & Big Sisters
- Ladies Relief Society

There are basically 3 ways to get involved with the Nevada County Food & Toy Run.

- Volunteer your time. There is lots to do. Special talents are greatly appreciated.

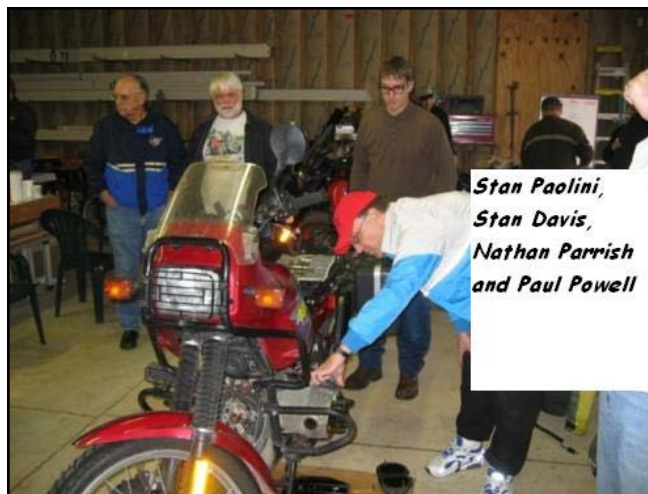

IT'S WHEN, NOT IF

Sooner or later you'll get a tire puncture on that two wheel fun machine of yours. Mine couldn't have come at a better time....after a breakfast with fellow motorcyclists. When we came out of the restaurant to mount up, they observed the double-headed nail driven into my rear tire. They sprang into action giving me not only a repaired tire, but also an education in motorcycle tire repair. Let me share it.



It was amazing. They prepared the glue and plug, pulled the nail, reamed the hole, inserted the plug, and when done there were still thirty pounds of air pressure remaining in the tire. Here's

what it takes.

The tools on the left side of the photo are those that come in the motorcycle tool kit. The tools on the right are from a kit pur-

chased at a local auto store. The nail at the bottom is the culprit that got my back tire, right up to its first head.

The repair process is relatively simple. 1) Remove the nail or other foreign object, 2) ream, i.e. roughen the hole with the T-handle tool, 3) insert the plug lubricated with glue, 4) withdraw the tool leaving the plug in place, 5) cut the excess rubber from the plug approximately level with the tread of the tire, and 6) using the air cartridges, insert enough air to get you to the nearest gas station to fill the tire completely.

My mentors offered a few additional tips. First and foremost, if you've still got air in your tire, work fast. Second, when you ream the hole, put some glue on the T-handle tool. Third, for the average nail hole, use the long pliable plugs (shown on the right) purchased from the local auto store. They insert more easily and seal effectively. Remember to cover the plug with glue prior to insertion. In case you're wondering, the T-handle tool is designed to release the plug when you withdraw it from the tire.

Now the tough question: Do I ride the tire or replace it? Short form answer: It depends. If the puncture is in the sidewall, replace the tire without delay. If the tire is relatively new, if the puncture is small and clean i.e. not jagged, if it's in the heart of the tread, and if the plug is tight and holding air, you may want to consider riding the tire for a while. Ultimately, this is an important
