The RCB brain trust (aka 'Board of Directors') met this month to review and plan club activities. Among the highlights:

- RCB is evaluating a "Christmas in Summer" toy ride-like event. Gauging club participation levels and a suitable benefactor organization have been the primary challenges.
- Gordy announced that a local BMW rider has offered his facilities for a 2011 Tech Daze. Next step is to pick a mutually satisfactory date. Expect it to be sometime this month.
- The lack of suitable camping facilities in the Visalia area has caused the club to regrettably cancel the Sequoia/King ride for next month. (A subsequent recommendation was to transfer the Sequoia/King budget to the Tech Daze event for snacks and drinks.)
- RCB is grateful for A&S' storage of our



camping gear, but the location isn't always convenient. RCB will be looking into trailer ownership and one member has already stepped forward to offer his trailer for sale. A board member was assigned the task of inspecting the trailer.
