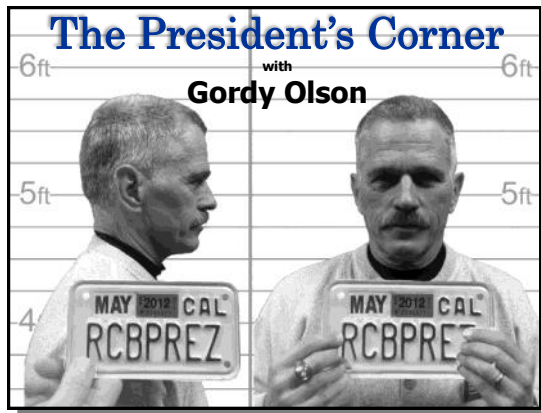

The first ever GPS training class (held jointly with CentralCal and NorCal BMW clubs) was a big success with over 40 participants. Minutes

- A. **Last Month's Minutes:** The Minutes from last month were approved without changes.
- B. **Treasurer's Report** – 2014 budget finalized. MOA rally is kept in as a place holder, although we do not believe there will be an RCB presence there. The riding clinic has been removed for 2014. The "tax" return was filed for 2013, no impact to the club due as the income level is below the threshold. The P & L has moved into the "black" for the fiscal year by \$69.61. The treasurer's report is attached and shows the balances and budgets for events for 2014. The event budgets total 4,825 (with the riding clinic removed). With right at 200 members annual dues received are approximately \$4,800.
- C. **Membership Report** – Membership is at 196 paid members.

Old Business

1. **GPS Seminar** – RCB will pick up cost for all of those who have signed up to help on rides, 14 in total. The seminar is set for 10:30 AM in Concord. Ken will have to get there early so he has posted a ride route which requires leaving Suzie's at 8:30 to get there on time. Hopefully someone who already knows how to operate their GPS will lead the group.
2. **Trinity Alps** – We have the entire group site area. We are close to capacity with many registered. Ray and the rest of the Rocklin Chapter will be headed there this weekend to scout restaurants, gas stations, rides and other attractions. There may be a need to haul some firewood up so if anybody is going by car or pickup and could haul a little wood it would help.
3. **Saddle Sore 1,000** – The members of the Gold Country Riders along with any RCB members and others are still planning a June 21 ride from A & S to Wendover, UT and back. Sign up on the forum if you desire to put 1,000 miles on your motorcycle in only one day.

New Business

1. **Lois Lewis Memorial Poker Run** – The event is organized with a similar program as last year leaving A & S at about 9:30 and gathering clues to complete a poker hand. Some of the clues may take some navigating adding to the intrigue. BBQ will follow at Phil and Mary's home.
2. **Gordy has been thinking** – Gordy reported to the board that he had been thinking. This statement brought laughter for some reason. He has been thinking that since we are maintaining an even keel financially with dues covering the event costs perhaps The Board should consider limiting or eliminating some co-pays for Club events and/or offering membership fee incentives. The Board will be considering alternatives and making final decisions in these regards later in the year after further research and discussion.
3. **Another raise for the officers and board** – Jack Klauschie moved that the officers and board members get another raise tripling our current salary of \$00.00000000 per year. The raise was approved by those in attendance.

Well the Trinity Lake recon mission was a success this weekend. Mike, Ray and I rode a little over 800 miles Saturday and Sunday to scout out the KOA campsite, roads, and the town of Trinity Center.



We were fortunate enough to meet with the camp host at the KOA and they gave us a quick tour of the area. The group site is nice and roomy with plenty of grassy areas and shade and is right next to the water. Each site has a fire ring as well. Cabins are right next to the group tent area and looked nice from

the outside each including a nice deck out back. There is a snack bar by the main entrance and they server burgers and dogs and the such. We have access to a large pavilion in case of inclement weather. Cell phone coverage at the campsite was excellent but pretty sketchy elsewhere.



The town of Trinity Center is pretty small with a single gas station and mini-market. There are a couple of small diner type restaurants there and one pizza place about 8 miles up north in Coffee Creek that was highly recommended. If you forgot any big ticket items at home, Weaverville is 30 miles south of Trinity Center and should have anything you need.



For those of you that have never been in that part of the world, you're in for a treat. The roads and scenery in the area are spectacular. We are planning a Saturday club ride and which will lead us in a westerly direction along hwy 299 towards Arcata on the coast and we will be stopping for lunch at the

Samoa Cookhouse in Samoa. For the ride back we recommend a couple of routes. Some will simply want to take hwy 299 back to Trinity Center

(hey, it looks different going the other way). For those a bit more adventurous, we will be heading south along hwy 101 and then cut back east along hwy 36. As a disclaimer, Hwy 36 is a very technical road and probably one of the most difficult roads I've been on. It's extremely twist with the road narrowing down to single lanes



in some area. Once you leave the coastal area, the road leads your through a maze of beautiful redwoods. It's a wonderful road with great scenery but it's not for everyone. Total ride mileage for the day will be around 300 miles going the hwy 36 route and a little less going back hwy 299. Garmin routes are posted on the RCB website.

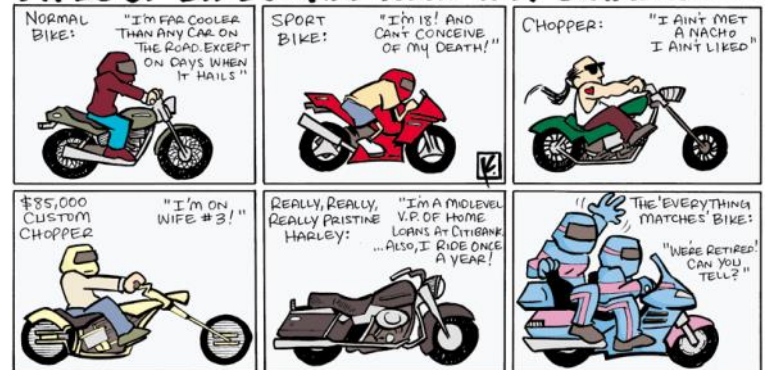

A TOUR OF THE SOUTHWEST + PAONIA RALLY

Ken Caruthers and I have been discussing this for quite a while, how can we encourage people to go on a touring ride who may not have done one before? Granted, there are a lot of our members that have ridden across the country any number of times, but for those who are new to touring we felt it would be a good idea to set up a well organized tour, without demanding levels of miles between stops, a 'go as you please' pace, several options to bail out and head home, and an excellent destination. So, that's what we did. We came up with a ride that will cover about 350 miles per day, taking four days to get to the Top O' the Rockies Rally in Paonia, CO, and will explore some of the greatest roads and most beautiful country along the way.

We will be leaving Susie's on **Monday**, July 14 at 9:00 AM, heading up I-80 to Fernley, NV, and across Nevada on US 50 to our first stop in Eureka, NV. We'll be staying at the Eureka Inn/Best Western Plus that night.

Tuesday finds us going east and south to Panguitch, UT, staying at the Purple Sage Motel. The roads between Cedar City and Panguitch are outstanding motorcycle roads with incredible views of the Cedar Breaks National Monument.

Wednesday we'll be riding on one of the best motorcycle roads in the country - highway 12 from Panguitch to Torrey. Bryce Canyon is on this road, which should give you some idea of the scenery. After that highway 95 going to Blanding, UT, will remind you of the scenery from the roadrunner/coyote cartoons we all watched as kids, minus the falling anvils and pianos. We'll be staying at the Gateway Inn in Blanding that night.

More fantastic roads will be on tap for **Thursday**, in particular the Million Dollar Highway between Silverton and Ouray, CO, one of those roads you just have to do on a motorcycle at some time in your life; it's that outstanding. If you've come along this far, you might as well attend the rally in Paonia, a favorite of many of the RCB members.

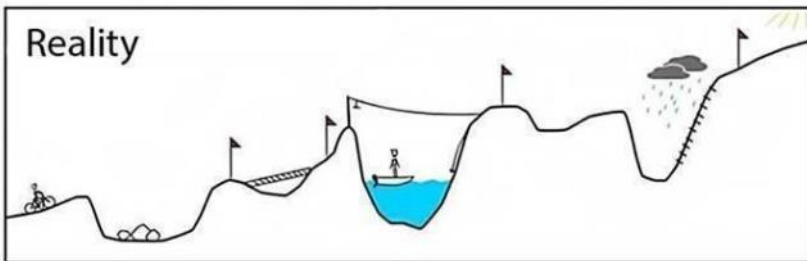
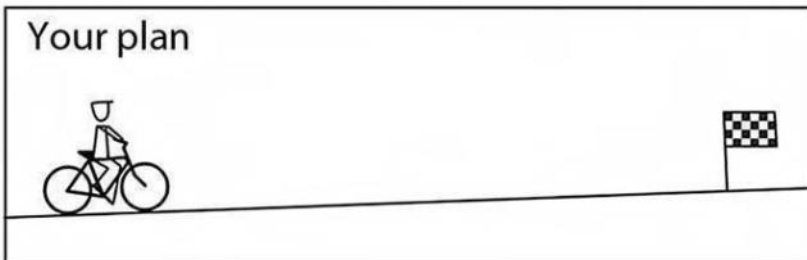
